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01.33 - Use of Thermometers

Purpose

To define measures to prevent the spread of infection through use of patient thermometers and to define the guidelines for the safe use and care of thermometers.

Audience

All employees of UTMB hospitals, clinics, contract workers, volunteers, and students.

Policy

- Electronic thermometers may be used for all patients, including those in isolation.
- The thermometer shall not be placed on the patient's bedside table or any potentially contaminated surface in the patient's room.
- The thermometer or any other part shall be disinfected with 70-90% ethyl or isopropyl alcohol if it has had contact with a contaminated surface, such as a bedside table, and before each and after each use.
- Thermometers may be cleaned using soap and cool tap water and drying with a paper towel at the sink in the patient's room before and after each use.
- Thermometers that are shared between patients will have a disposable protective cover.
