Need for More Accessible Study Space in the Student Center and SAH/SON building	<p>Dr. Saavedra reported that she is talking with OUA regarding options to raise funds for the renovations for the student center. They are currently discussing contacting Alumni to explore their interest in supporting this effort. She also stated that two unexpected bills related to the student center had been received. One was for payment of fees related to computer use in the amount of \$24,000 and the other was for utility charges in the amount of \$100,000. She noted that there currently is an account established to pay utility charges but with the rising costs may necessitate exploring other sources of revenue.</p> <p>Jodean stated that there are draft plans to renovate the 3rd floor of JSC but there is no funding at this time.</p> <p>Phyllis Jendrusch reported that the plan to install badge readers to allow access to more rooms in the SAHS/SON building is still being worked on. TARGET STATE

AMBULATORY EMR

- Students should have view-only access to most activities, and should be well-trained in CDR so they can look at labs, previous progress notes, information entered during the current visit, etc.
- Students should have data-entry access to the following sections: patient ID, chief complaint, vitals, immunization history, questionnaires, progress notes (complete Visit Navigator access would also be acceptable)
- Students should be able to enter orders at a pended status
- Student notes should be clearly labeled as such

- Students should not be able to sign or release orders
- Students should not be able to close an encounter
- Students should not have to close/sign their progress note in order for the physician to close the encounter
- Students should not have access to SmartTools

INPATIENT ORDER ENTRY

- Students should have view-only access to most activities.
- Students should be able to enter orders at a pended status.

- Students should not be able to sign or release orders

CURRENT STATE

AMBULATORY EMR

Medical students have been trained and given access to the Epic CDR, where they can review lab/radiology results and patient charts, which includes real-time viewing of information entered during patient encounters.

INPATIENT ORDER ENTRY

Medical students can view both the CDR (lab and radiology results and outpatient visits) and inpatient rounds reports (including problem list, current orders, and care team).
