

GMEC Quality Improvement Policy

To ensure a standardized curriculum Quality Improvement, the GMEC unanimously approved requiring all residency programs to complete core modules of the Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI) Curriculum effective July 1, 2015.

All new House Staff within the first three months of employment will complete the required first 5 Quality Improvement modules. If a new incoming House Staff has completed the IHI training prior to beginning their residency, they do not have to complete the modules but must provide a copy of certification to their program coordinator.

The modules are:

QI 101: Introduction to Health Care Improvement

QI 102: How to Improve with the Model for Improvement

QI 103: Testing and Measuring Changes with PDSA Cycles

QI 104: Interpreting Data: Run Charts, Control Charts, and Other Measurement Tools

QI 105: Leading Quality Improvement

Failure to complete the modules will result in House Staff removed from clinical service until the training requirement is satisfied.

One faculty member must complete the 5 modules, preferably the Program Director or Quality Improvement Faculty for the Department.

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
