



Technology-related Suggestions for Pediatric Grand Rounds Presenters

Multi-point videoconferencing is used for Pediatric Grand Rounds and M&M Conferences. Distant audiences can see the slide show and hear, but not see, the presenter.

PLEASE....

- 1. Do not use a laser pointer as it will not be seen at the distant sites. Instead use the mouse cursor.
- 2. Use a lavalier/lapel microphone
- 3. Acknowledge the distance audiences, letting them know you are aware of their participation.

DURING Q&A TIME

- 1. *Involve* distant participants in the Q&A time by specifically inviting their questions. "Bay Colony or PCP, do you have any questions?"
- 2. **Sound for distant sites.** The ceiling microphones will pick up the speaker *and* audience voices for the distant sites. Nevertheless, it is still a good idea to repeat the question .
- Sound for the main room (RB62.312). Often the audience on one side of the room cannot hear comments/questions from the other side of the room. This is another reason to repeat the question- for participants on the other side of the room. Other options include:

 a. Ask the commenter/questioner to speak up so the other side of the room can hear.
 b. the other supported to participant to be added to b
 - b. Hand the commenter/questioner the hand-held mic.

OTHER NOTES

- 1. Arrive early. Please arrive at 7:30 to check your presentation.
- 2. **Other equipment.** Alert the Grand Rounds Coordinator in advance if you plan to use:
 - a. Audience response system (clickers)- this needs to be reserved.
 - b. Mac laptop or ipad
 - c. Other equipment
- 3. **Recording.** We have the capacity to record the session. This is not routine, but if you want your session recorded, please ask ahead of time.
