Organization of the Department of Rehabilitation Services

Purpose	This document explains the organization of the administrative and patient care personnel within the Department of Rehabilitation Services.
Audience	All members of the Department of Rehabilitation Services.
General Department Organization	The Department of Rehabilitation Services falls under the Health System Leadership: EVP and CEO, VP of Academic Medical Center Galveston, and Director of Rehabilitation Services. The department consists of five divisions: Administration, Acute Physical Therapy, Outpatient Physical Therapy, Inpatient and Outpatient Occupational Therapy and Angleton Danbury Campus. Administration division provides oversight and support to all locations for personnel and financial management, education, training, and quality service metrics. Acute Physical Therapy Division provides oversight of services at three campuses. Outpatient Physical Therapy Division provides oversight at three clinics. Occupational Therapy Division provides oversight for inpatient and outpatient services at all four campuses. Angleton Danbury Campus provides oversight for inpatient and outpatient physical therapy services. Each clinical division is managed by a Rehabilitation Services Manager.
Occupational Therapy	Occupational Therapy is composed of licensed Occupational Therapists (OTR), Certified Occupational Therapy Assistants (COTA) and non-licensed support staff. Occupational Therapy is divided into separate clinical areas. These areas include: Inpatient and Out-patient clinical services, Hand Rehabilitation, Pediatrics, NICU, Complex Care, Texas Department of Criminal Justice, and WorkSTEPS®. Specialty areas include: Cancer, Stroke, LVAD, Burn, Ortho and Trauma.

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Physical Therapy

Physical Therapy is composed of licensed Physical Therapists (PT), Licensed Physical Therapist Assistants (PTA), and non-licensed support staff. Physical Therapy is divided into separate clinical areas. These areas include: Inpatient and Outpatient clinical services, Pediatrics, Women's Health, Sports Medicine, The Texas Department of Criminal Justice, Lymphedema, Wheelchair Clinic and WorkSTEPS®. Specialty areas include: Cancer, Stroke, LVAD, Burn, Ortho and Trauma.
