To ensure that patient care personnel of the Respiratory Care Services Staff are knowledgeable and proficient in the utilization of equipment and technique of Surfactant Administration in the neonatal area.

Scope Policy

Accountability/Training

The policy applies to all Licensed Respiratory Care Practitioners employed by the Respiratory Care Services and trained in ISCU who have demonstrated proficiency in delivery of Surfactant.

Authorized staff members will begin performing Surfactant Therapy Administration under the following conditions:

Procedures

Step	Action
1	The staff member has been in-serviced on the procedure and has shown proficiency under direct supervision.
2	Administration of three successful surfactant treatments as observed by a Clinical Educator, Supervisor, Transport Nurse, or Physician.
3	Proper documentation in EMR
